

September's meeting was a fairly quiet one with only 26 members plus one visitor attending and 11 had to leave early. I was unable to attend as I was on holiday but I was given some brief details.

John worked with some newer turners while several members such as Dave Nash and Malcolm Thorpe demonstrated approaches to finials and guided others to experiment with them. Malcolm Thorpe sharpened and re-profiled a large number of the club gouges and chisels and he and Malcolm Edwards sorted through the sales table stuff and the boxes of wood to see what was usable. Dave Nash brought in some of the tools he made when he was first working to show how you could turn with the most basic of tools. One of them was made from an old engine con-rod. Chris Jones demonstrated how to make hedgehogs and Graham Earp went on to make one.

Rob's wife Helen finally got to finish her mouse with help from Cliff – and a very fine mouse it is too! This means that although Rob is smiling here, he is very worried that his workshop is about to be taken over by the Great Mouse Production Emporium!
